



Meet Chenamma

For years, Chenamma spent hours of her mornings walking to collect the water her family needed to survive. Without a source of safe water at home, Chenamma's family was often sick. She changed their lives when she got a small loan for a household water connection. Now Chenamma can grow fruits to sell and her daughters and granddaughters attend school.

When women have access to safe water and toilets at home, they are empowered to change their world. No longer burdened by the water crisis, they can care for their families. They can start small businesses, adding to their household income. They have the time and water to garden and cook food for their families. And, they no longer face unsafe situations when relieving themselves outdoors or walking to distant sources for water.

Financing can help end the global water crisis

The water crisis looks different in different parts of the world. We believe in putting the power of water directly into the hands of the people who need it. Through our work we have found that when given an opportunity to pay for water and sanitation improvements with loans, families opt to finance long-term solutions versus struggle day-to-day to find that next liter of water or a place to go.

Loan repayment rates average 99%, and every repaid loan means another family can get safe water at home. It's a cycle that continues to reach more people, creating new opportunities for families around the world.

Together with our partners around the world, we helped mobilize more than \$656 million in capital in 2022 to support small loans that brought safe water and sanitation to people in need. We are helping unlock the flow of capital into the water and sanitation sector to ensure that, like the water solutions we make possible, affordable finance can flow down to those who need it most.


In Peru, we work with various partners to increase affordable access to safe water and sanitation to families in their communities.

MiBanco is one of the largest microfinance institutions in Peru and offers loans for water and sanitation across their entire branch network. We provided extensive technical assistance to design and develop a water and sanitation loan program so they can provide small, affordable loans to people in need in their communities.

To date, MiBanco has disbursed more than 841,000 loans, reaching more than 3.1 million people with access to safe water or sanitation.



Our partners have disbursed 11.6 million loans for \$4.1 billion, reaching more than 52 million people with safe water or sanitation.




The Worth of Water




